



What is there about our culture that we are so overwhelmed by the culture that we can not see, or maybe even seek, God in our need? Today's Gospel is one of my favorite Post Resurrection events which was passed on by the events and the recording of them.

Faith Formation Corner by Deacon Bill Kessler

I liken it to my busy former life. I looked forward to coming to Mass so I could get some time away from the hustle and bustle. Yet, how many times did I

catch myself drifting off to the week ahead?

With that in mind, maybe we can empathize with Cleopas and his companion on their journey in today's Gospel. Luke tells a wonderfully

adaptive encounter that we can take to heart. One could liken this Gospel to something we do frequently. Do we have the same encounter?

The fear and sorrow of the travelers was so real, that even when the Lord was in their presence, they didn't know Him. But two things happened . . . someone proclaimed the Scriptures to them. They invited their unrecognized companion to pray with them and they knew WHO it was in the breaking of the Bread. We wouldn't be far off is we said this Gospel describes our Mass today. We have the Scriptures broken open for us and then we are gifted with the Bread which Jesus broke for the two disciples.

May this Gospel always be an encouragement to listen intently to the proclamation of the Readings and observe the Consecration of the Host as it becomes the Body of Christ. Then might we seek to have the experience of the two disciples . . . their fear and sorrow gave way to their life changing observation: "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" Then with certain faith they proclaimed that both Jesus was Risen and how: . . . the two recounted what had taken place on the way and . . . how . . . Jesus . . . was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

Sound familiar? That is our Eucharistic Celebration; The Liturgy of The Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Might we give ourselves over to Jesus so we can have the same encounter with Our Risen Lord as did these two disciples.


